THE EVENT WAS GRACED BY OUR VERY OWN ROTARY INTERNATIONAL DISTRICT 3860 GOVERNOR ARLENE ADALAWAN, WHOSE PRESENCE HIGHLIGHTED THE IMPORTANCE OF SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITY SERVICE. BY PROMOTING PROPER HAND HYGIENE, THE PROJECT HELPS PREVENT THE SPREAD OF COMMUNICABLE DISEASES, REDUCES ABSENTEEISM, AND ENCOURAGES LIFELONG HEALTHY HABITS AMONG STUDENTS.

THIS MEANINGFUL PROJECT REFLECTS ROTARY'S AREAS OF FOCUS, PARTICULARLY:

1. DISEASE PREVENTION AND TREATMENT – BY PROMOTING PROPER HAND HYGIENE AND REDUCING THE SPREAD OF ILLNESSES.
2. WATER, SANITATION, AND HYGIENE (WASH) – BY PROVIDING ACCESS TO A CLEAN AND FUNCTIONAL HANDWASHING FACILITY.
3. BASIC EDUCATION AND LITERACY – BY FOSTERING A HEALTHIER SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT WHERE STUDENTS CAN LEARN EFFECTIVELY.
4. COMMUNITY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT – BY CONTRIBUTING TO THE OVERALL WELL-BEING AND PRODUCTIVITY OF THE COMMUNITY THROUGH IMPROVED PUBLIC HEALTH.

ALIGNED WITH THE GOALS OF ROTARY DISTRICT 3860, THIS PROJECT DEMONSTRATES ROTARY'S COMMITMENT TO SUSTAINABLE, HIGH-IMPACT SERVICE THAT EMPOWERS COMMUNITIES AND TRANSFORMS LIVES.

HANDWASHING FACILITY TURNOVER CEREMONY



LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVE

RCBN TURNS COMPASSION INTO ACTION: EMPOWERING PDLS WITH SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD SKILLS

ON JULY 4, 2026, THE ROTARY CLUB OF BUTUAN NORTH (RCBN) COMMENCED THE NEW ROTARY YEAR BY TRANSLATING EMPATHY INTO MEANINGFUL, HANDS-ON COMMUNITY ACTION. IN A TARGETED EFFORT TO SUPPORT REHABILITATION AND SELF-RELIANCE, THE CLUB TURNED ITS FOCUS TOWARD THE BUREAU OF JAIL MANAGEMENT AND PENOLOGY (BJMP), DONATING A SUBSTANTIAL SUPPLY OF RUG-MAKING RAW MATERIALS TO THE PERSONS DEPRIVED OF LIBERTY (PDLS).

THIS LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVE IS DESIGNED TO DO FAR MORE THAN PROVIDE A TEMPORARY ACTIVITY. 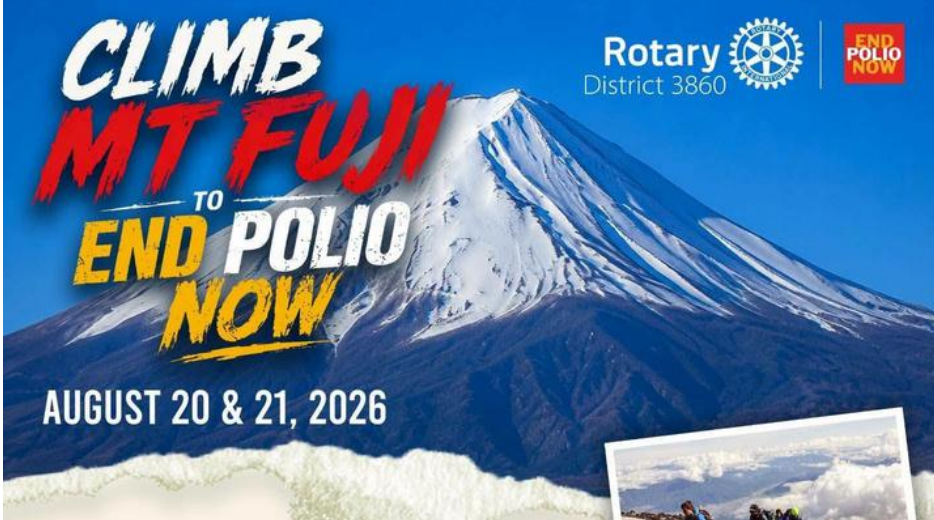
