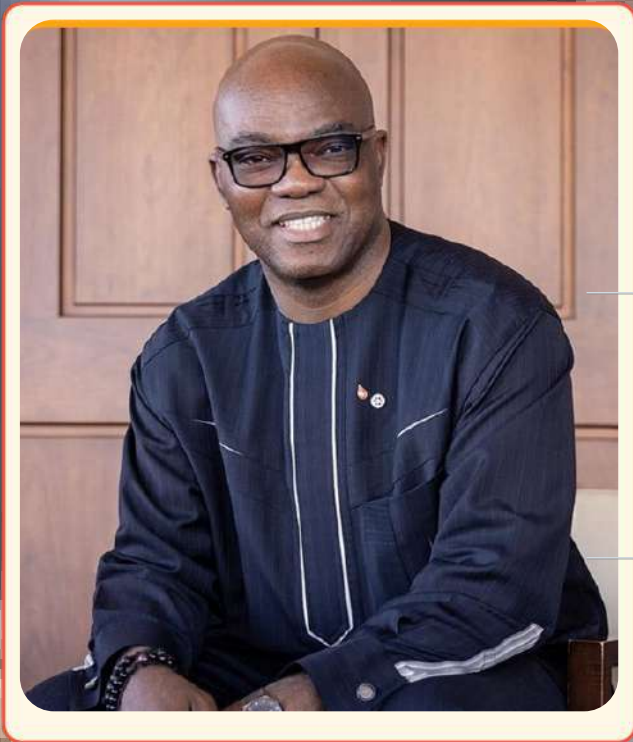

Through Service Above Self and the theme “Create Lasting Impact,” the club continues to support education and build safer, better learning environments for children.

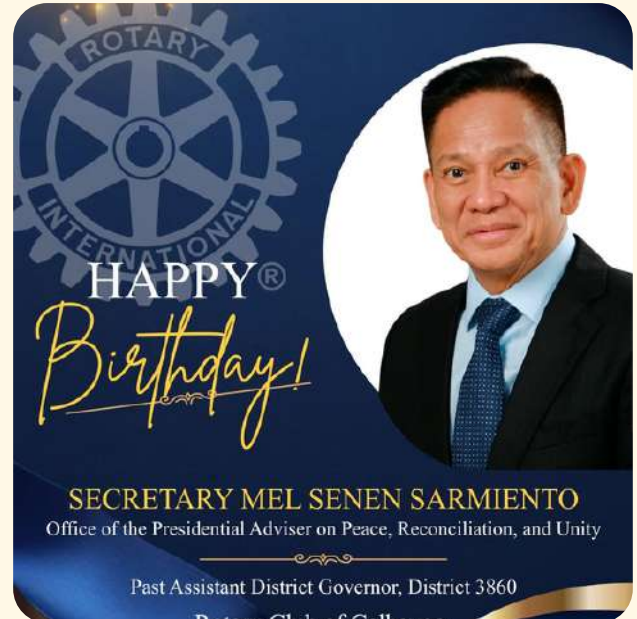

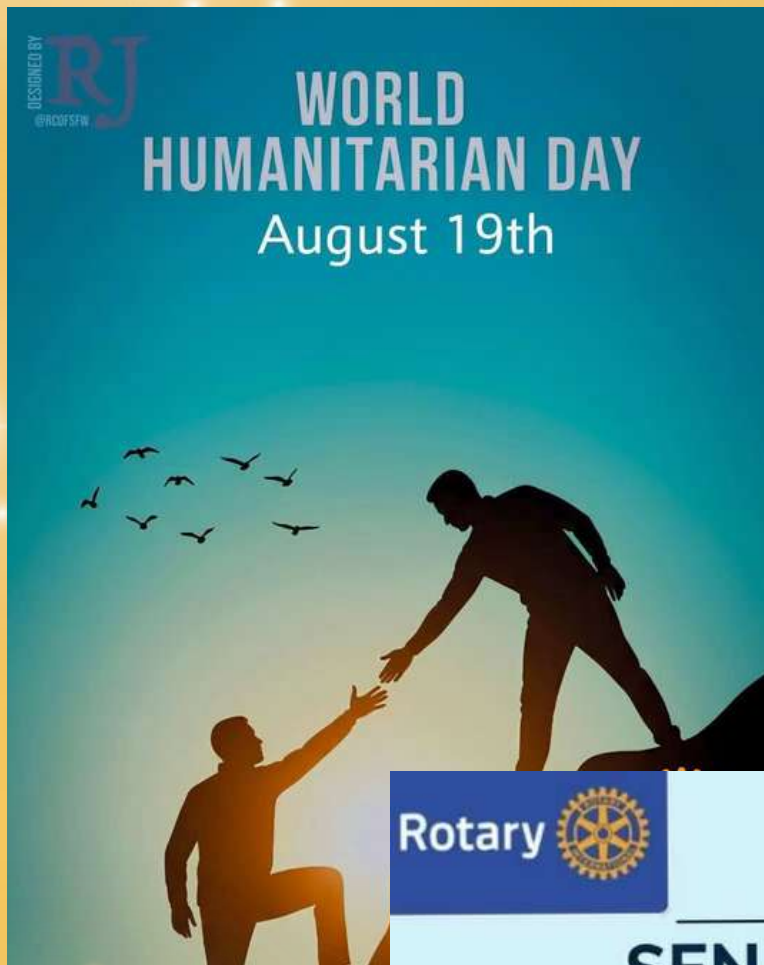

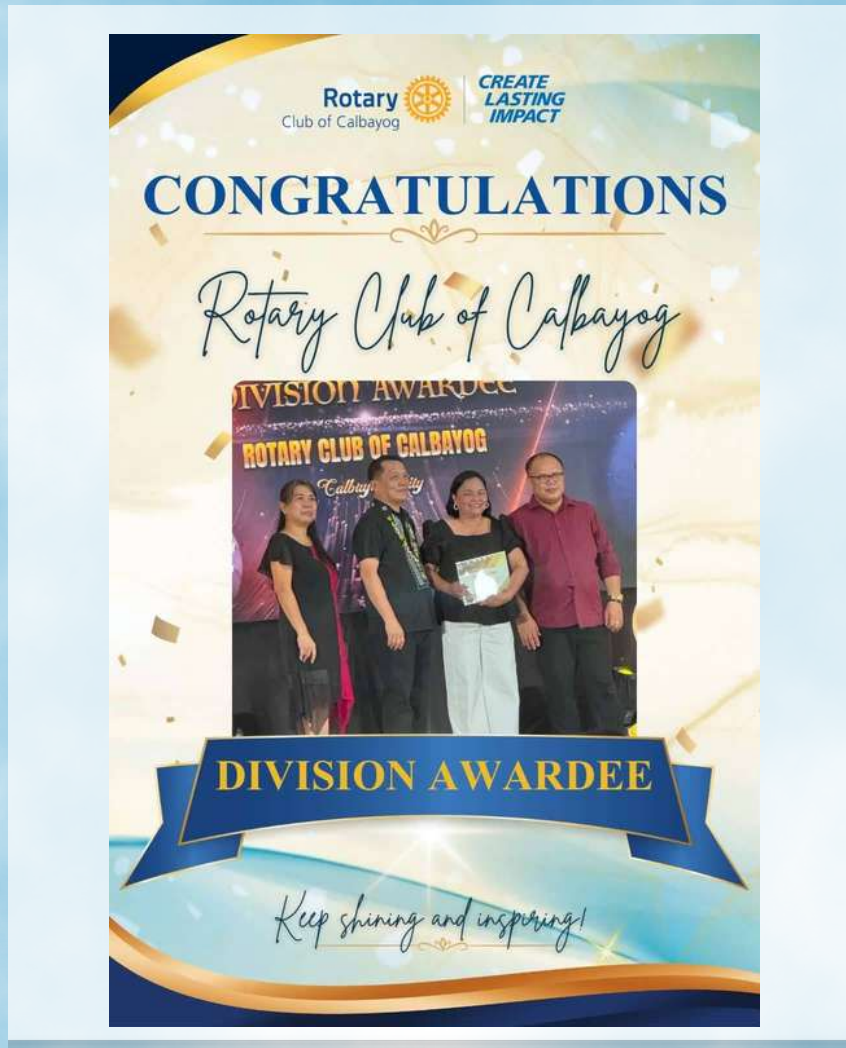
