We are grateful to Past Assistant Governor and District RCC Chair Jannette Valderosa for generously sharing her time, wisdom, and experience in guiding and orienting our RCC. Their commitment to community service strengthens our ability to reach people where help is most needed. As we welcome this new partnership, may we continue to work together with compassion and purpose, turning shared ideas into meaningful action and lasting impact.

Our commitment to saving lives was also demonstrated through our participation in the Bloodletting Activity 2026 of Areas 2B, 2C, and 2E, led by the Rotary Club of Waling-Waling Davao, on August 15 at Gig Oca Robles Seamen’s Hospital. With the theme, “One Drop of Humanity. Give Blood. Save Lives,” Rotarians, blood donors, volunteers, healthcare professionals, and community partners came together for a simple yet life-changing act of service. Blood donation reminds us that sometimes, creating lasting impact can begin with something as simple as giving a part of ourselves to help another person live.

One of the most meaningful highlights of August was our 51st Charter Anniversary celebration on August 25. More than five decades of service is a remarkable milestone, and it is a testament to the generations of Rotarians who have given their time, talent, friendship, and dedication to the Rotary Club of Central Davao. As we celebrated this milestone with our honored guests, fellow Rotarians, friends, and sister clubs, we were reminded that the strength of our Club lies not only in its history, but also in the people who continue to carry its legacy forward.

Our Charter Anniversary was made even more significant through two important service activities in Tamugan. We proudly celebrated the turnover of the Tamugan Feeding Center at Tamugan Elementary School, a project made possible through three Rotary District Grants. The feeding center represents our continuing commitment to the health, nutrition, and well-being of children. It provides a dedicated space where feeding programs can be carried out and where young learners can receive not only nourishment, but also care and encouragement.

We are especially grateful to the Rotary Club of Manila Bay, which generously provided essential kitchen equipment and other needed items to complete and prepare the facility for operation. Their contribution provided the final touches that helped make the feeding center more functional and ready to serve the community. This project is a beautiful reminder that when resources, generosity, and a shared vision come together, we can create something that will continue to benefit our communities long after the project itself is completed.

Alongside the feeding center turnover, we also brought healthcare services closer to the people of Tamugan through Bayanihan sa Kalusugan, held at Tamugan Elementary School. The medical caravan served more than 100 residents from Tamugan and neighboring communities, providing free doctor consultations, general check-ups, Fasting Blood Sugar, Hemoglobin, Cholesterol, and Bone Density testing. Through the support of the City Health Office, beneficiaries were also able to access free chest X-ray examinations.

Our valued partner Unilab further strengthened the activity by providing discounted medicines, vitamins, and other health essentials. The Rotary Community Corps of Central Davao also played an important role by mobilizing residents, assisting with venue preparation, and helping ensure the smooth and organized flow of beneficiaries. Bayanihan sa Kalusugan showed us once again that meaningful healthcare service becomes possible when organizations, professionals, volunteers, and communities work together toward one purpose.

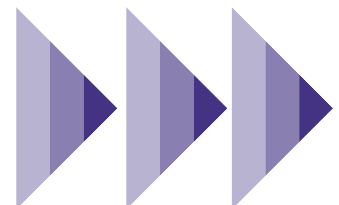

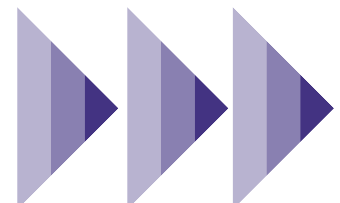

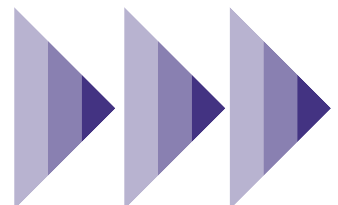

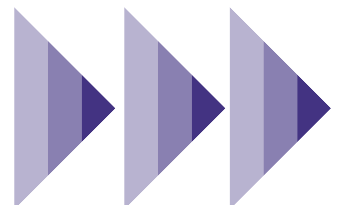

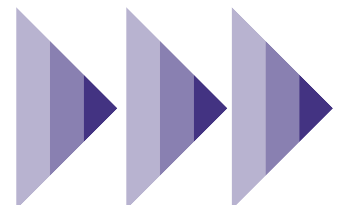
