The gift of mothers' milk

Sustained by donations from nursing women, milk banks provide a lifeline to vulnerable newborns

When Typhoon Haiyan devastated Tacloban in 2013, donated breast milk from the Dr. Jose Fabella Memorial Hospital became a lifeline for vulnerable newborns. Led by Dr. Estrella "Star" Jusi, the hospital coordinated with the Department of Health, military personnel, and other milk banks to deliver 86 liters of pasteurized donor milk despite blocked roads and grounded flights.

Human milk banks provide safe, donated breast milk to premature and critically ill infants when their mothers are unable to breastfeed. Recommended by the World Health Organization and UNICEF, donor milk significantly reduces the risk of life-threatening illnesses and improves survival among low-birth-weight babies.

In the Philippines, what began as a Rotary Club initiative has grown into one of Southeast Asia's strongest human milk bank networks. Supported by more than 30 Rotary Foundation Global Grants, the country now has 39 milk banks serving hospitals nationwide. Rotary's partnership with health institutions has helped provide equipment, expand facilities, and strengthen neonatal care.

Modern milk banks follow strict donor screening, pasteurization, and quality-control protocols, making donated milk a safe and trusted option. Similar Rotary-supported initiatives have expanded across Brazil, Australia, New Zealand, North America, and other countries, helping thousands of infants receive the nutrition they need.

Beyond providing nourishment, milk banks embody compassion and community. Mothers donate excess milk to give fragile newborns a chance to survive and thrive, while volunteers, healthcare workers, and Rotarians work together to ensure every donation reaches those who need it most. Their collective efforts demonstrate that a simple act of generosity can create a lasting impact and give every child the best possible start in life.
