One Simple Word: Gratitude

Leaders highlight the power of gratitude at The Rotary Foundation Donor Summit

In a world where recognition often comes through grand gestures, The Rotary Foundation's 2026 Donor Summit in Taipei offered a much simpler reminder: sometimes, one word is enough—gratitude.

Gathering more than 1,000 donors, the summit celebrated not only financial generosity but also the spirit of service that continues to connect Rotarians across countries, communities, and generations. Rotary leaders emphasized that every contribution, whether large or small, becomes part of something greater when people come together with a shared purpose.

The stories shared during the summit demonstrated that Rotary's impact goes beyond numbers. Its work has reached communities through programs that promote peace, fight disease, provide clean water, improve education, support families, and protect the environment. Behind every project are people who choose to give their time, resources, and compassion.

One story that captured this spirit came from Past District Governor Nellie Lin of Taiwan, who recalled receiving a simple packet of spices from Rotary members in India during the COVID-19 pandemic. What may have seemed like a small gesture became a lasting reminder of friendship, solidarity, and the connections created through service.

This is perhaps what makes gratitude so meaningful in Rotary. It is not simply about saying "thank you." It is about recognizing the people who serve beside us, remembering those who helped build the path before us, and continuing the work so that others may benefit in the future.
