Food as medicine for TB recovery

Rediscovering a weapon against the deadliest infectious disease, TB advocates look to better nutrition

A Rotary-supported project in Coimbatore, India, is highlighting an often-overlooked factor in tuberculosis (TB) treatment: nutrition. The initiative provides nutritional protein supplements to undernourished TB patients alongside their regular medications, helping address the severe weight loss and weakness commonly associated with the disease.

The project began in 2024 as a small pilot serving about 200 vulnerable patients. Encouraged by the results, the Rotary Club of Coimbatore New Town secured a \$35,000 Rotary Foundation global grant, allowing the program to expand to hundreds of patients, with plans to reach around 1,500 by mid-2027.

The need is significant. TB and malnutrition can reinforce one another: poor nutrition weakens the immune system, making it harder for the body to control the bacteria, while TB itself can reduce appetite and increase the body's nutritional demands. For patients already struggling with severe malnutrition, this can also make it more difficult to tolerate and continue their medications.

The renewed focus on nutrition reflects growing evidence that food assistance can play an important role in TB prevention and recovery. In Coimbatore, health officials have reported encouraging improvements, including a reduction in mortality and better adherence to treatment.

The story demonstrates how community-based Rotary projects can complement medical treatment by addressing the broader needs of patients. As the global fight against TB evolves, the experience in Coimbatore offers a powerful reminder that treating disease is not only about medicines—it is also about giving people the nourishment and support they need to recover.

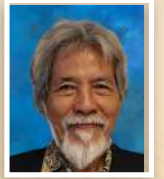

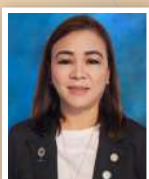

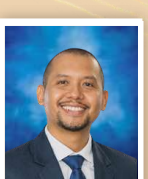
