As we look back on the impactful initiatives of August, this image serves as a proud reminder of how meaningful community partnerships allow us to uplift lives and create lasting impact together.



THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

August 2026 will be remembered as a month where service took root in the hearts of communities and partnerships blossomed across General Santos. From the induction of fellow Rotary Clubs across Area 2FGH to two flagship outreach programs, our club lived out the Rotary ideal: turning compassion into concrete action.

On August 8, our members, together with partner organizations, brought transformative support to the students, parents, and faculty of Antonio D. Pendatun IP Elementary School. This school-based outreach touched all several of Rotary's Areas of Focus.

We distributed school kits, and pre-loved books to young learners, and donated feeding tables and benches to create a more conducive environment for the students.

Our partner dentists from PDA conducted fluoride applications for children, while we held feeding sessions, and distributed sacks of rice for the school feeding program. For maternal and child health, the service club distributed dental kits to the learner and hygiene kits for the mothers alongside a tooth-brushing demonstration, and essential medicines were donated to the school clinic.

Students participated in a hands-on handwashing demonstration. We also provided gallons of liquid soap, and provided new faucets and light bulbs in the comfort rooms to improve sanitation facilities.

Parents attended a demonstration on vegetable planting, coupled with the distribution of vegetable seeds and fertilizers to encourage home gardening and food security.

Members and students together planted Tabebuia trees around the school grounds, greening the campus and teaching the value of environmental stewardship.

What made this day truly special was the partnership we forged with the Barangay LGU and the beneficiaries themselves, especially the students, parents, and teachers of Antonio D. Pendatun IP Elementary Sschool. They were not passive recipients but active collaborators, ensuring that every project met real needs and would be sustained long after our team left.

Just six days later, on August 14, our club responded to the urgent needs of earthquake and flood victims in Puting Bato, Brgy. Calumpang. It was made possible with the donation shared by the PAL Flight Attendants Association and close coordination with the Purok Officials. We distributed hygiene kits, blankets, sleeping mats, towels and t-shirts to sixty (60) affected families, bringing immediate relief, a message of hope and a smile in their difficult time.

None of this would have been possible without our dedicated partners: the Philippine Dental Association – General Santos City Chapter, Soroptimist International, the Philippine Institute of Architects – Greater Matutum Area, Rotaract Club of Stratford International, and GPA Design and Construction. Your expertise, generosity, and shared vision multiply the impact of our effort.

As we enter September, I invite each Greater Ladies to: - Settle your club dues to keep our programs running; - Attend our regular meetings and fellowship gatherings; - Bring in new members who believe in service above self; - Join our upcoming service projects and community outreach.

Let us carry forward the spirit of August throughout this service year. As Mother Teresa reminded us, "Do small things with great love." When we serve with all our heart, even the smallest act can change a life. Thank you everyone and let's carry on doing good and create lasting impact along the way.

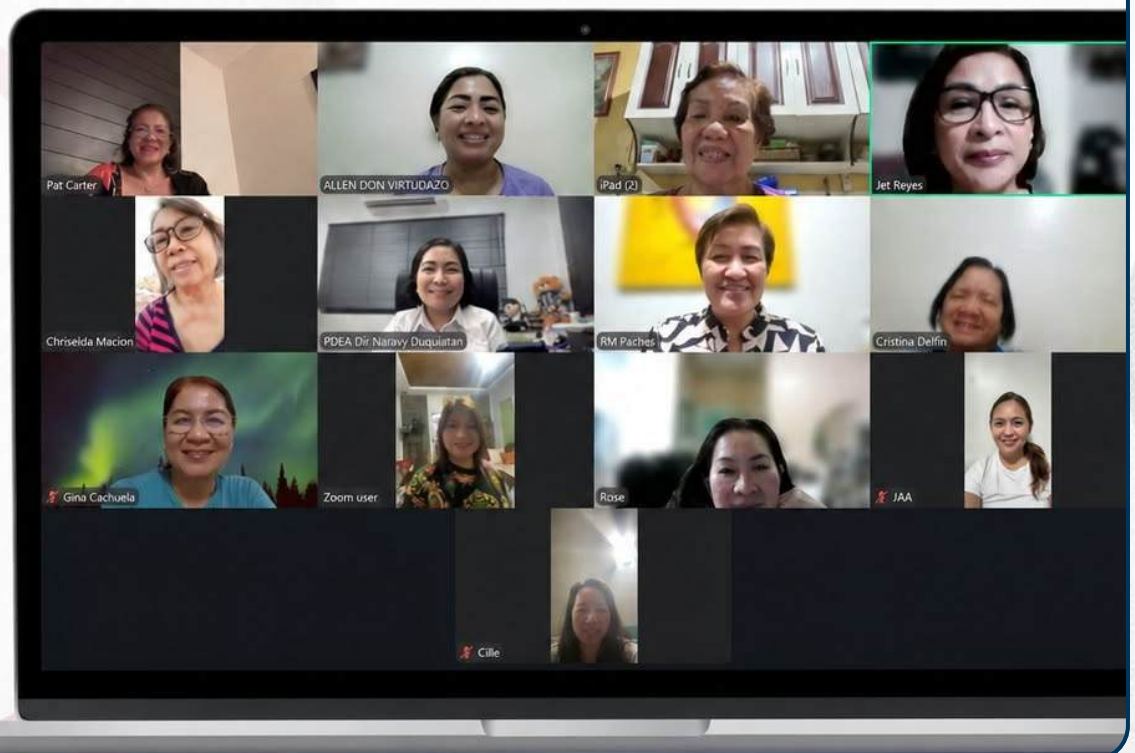

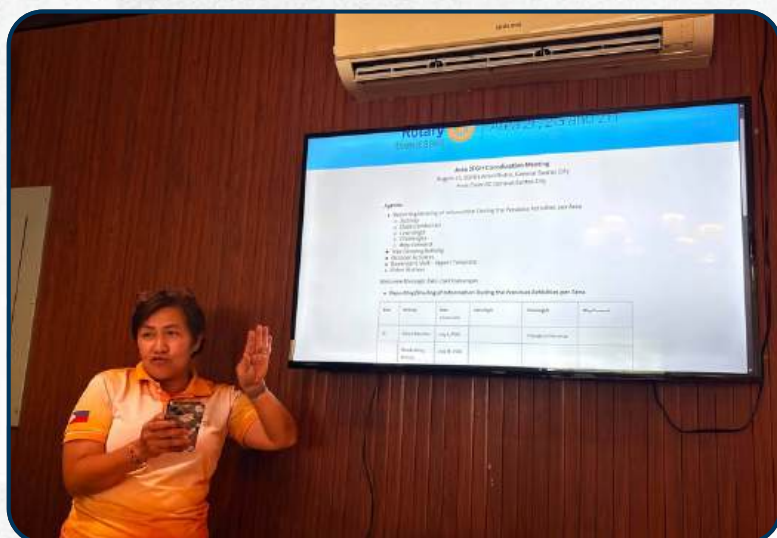

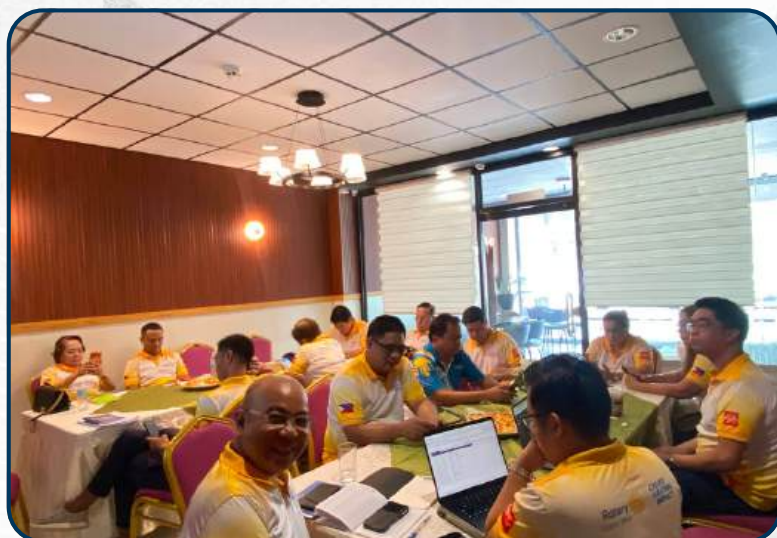
