Rotary has a way of surprising you. It surprises you when a stranger across the table becomes a lifelong friend. It surprises you when a small project in one neighbourhood ripples outward in ways you never imagined. And it may surprise you when you realise that the person Rotary has changed most ... is you.

That is why this year, we are called to harness the change within ourselves, to look to the future and to Create Lasting Impact.

Now, I want to be clear about what those words mean. Change is only the beginning. Impact is what endures. We must think of the long-term impact of every project. Storytelling is also an excellent way to recruit new members and raise funds. We need more people standing with us and more resources if we are to end polio, spread peace, and have a lasting impact on the world. We have set a goal of increasing membership to 1.25 million Rotarians and more than 125,000 Rotaractors by 2030, just in time for Rotary's 125th anniversary.

Sit down with your club and look back over your accomplishments in the last few years. Find your best year. Maybe it was a record year for new members. Maybe you reached a fundraising milestone. Maybe you completed a project that the whole community is still talking about. Once you find that year, I challenge you to do better than your best.

In these ways and more, we will Create Lasting Impact across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves.

Thank you, my dear friends. Now let's get to work.

The Rotary Club of Polomolok 101: A Legacy of Service



The Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 was officially chartered by Rotary International on August 31, 2005, through the dedicated efforts of its mother club, the Rotary Club of Midtown General Santos. While initial attempts to establish a Rotary club in Polomolok began as early as February 2003, it was only in January 2005 that persistence bore fruit. With the support of Rotary Club of Midtown General Santos, Omar Gallinero was appointed as the club's Charter President, leading 25 charter members from diverse professional backgrounds. The club was established under the leadership of then-District Governor Len Magno of District 3860.

The number 101 in the club's name holds special significance. First, it marks the club's founding during Rotary International's 101st anniversary. Second, it represents the club's distinction as the 101st chartered club under District 3860.

Registered under District 3860, Area 2F with Club Number 70517, the Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 continues to thrive, powered by a dedicated team of 26 committed individuals who embody the spirit of service above self.

We kicked off Rotary Year 2026–2027 with a meaningful celebration of service and fellowship!

Together with our fellow Rotary Clubs of Area 2F&G of District 3860, the Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 visited St. Agnes of Montepulciano Children's Home, Inc. to celebrate with the 21 children and the devoted sisters during our Rotary New Year project, "Our Children Today, Our Hope for Tomorrow."

As our humble contribution, our club donated two electric fans, a set of lunch boxes, pails and dippers, and vegetable seedlings to support the children's daily needs and help sustain their vegetable garden. Our fellow Rotary clubs also generously donated food supplies, hygiene kits, school materials, and other basic necessities.

The activity also featured a basic oral health education session conducted by PP Dr. Bel Acuesta, together with members of the Philippine Dental Association – General Santos City Chapter. The children learned the importance of proper oral hygiene and healthy dental habits through an engaging and educational presentation.

More than the gifts we brought, we shared something even more meaningful—our time, friendship, and love. Over a joyful meal, we celebrated, and created beautiful memories with the children, the sisters, and our fellow Rotarians. Seeing the smiles on the children's faces was the perfect way to begin another year of service.

As we embark on a new Rotary year, may we continue to unite in compassion, strengthen our communities, and inspire hope wherever we serve.

Every child deserves the opportunity to learn.

On July 13, 2026, the Rotary Club of Polomolok 101, in partnership with Barangay Magsaysay, witnessed the opening and ribbon cutting of a new Day Care Center in Purok Malnog—a place that now brings hope closer to the Indigenous (IP) children in the community.

Through the initiative of PE Rhoda and President Rutcie Tito, and with the generosity of our members, our club donated lumber, plywoods, floor mats, ceiling fans, hygiene kits, school supplies, goodies, and multivitamins to help create a safe and welcoming learning environment. President Rutcie also donated a decorative tarp that added color and warmth to the Day Care Center, making it an even more inviting place for the children.

For years, these young learners—some only three to four years old—had to travel long distance along dusty and hilly roads just to reach the nearest Day Care Center. Today, they now have a classroom much closer to home, where they can learn, play, and dream. During the opening, Pp Dr. Bel Acuesta and PP Dr Mel Deypalan also conducted a basic oral health education and proper handwashing drill for the children and their mothers and guardians, reminding us that caring for a child's future also means caring for their health.

This project is a testament to what can be achieved when a community comes together with a shared purpose. At the Rotary Club of Polomolok 101, we believe that even the smallest act of kindness can create opportunities, inspire hope, and create a lasting impact—one child, one family, and one community at a time.

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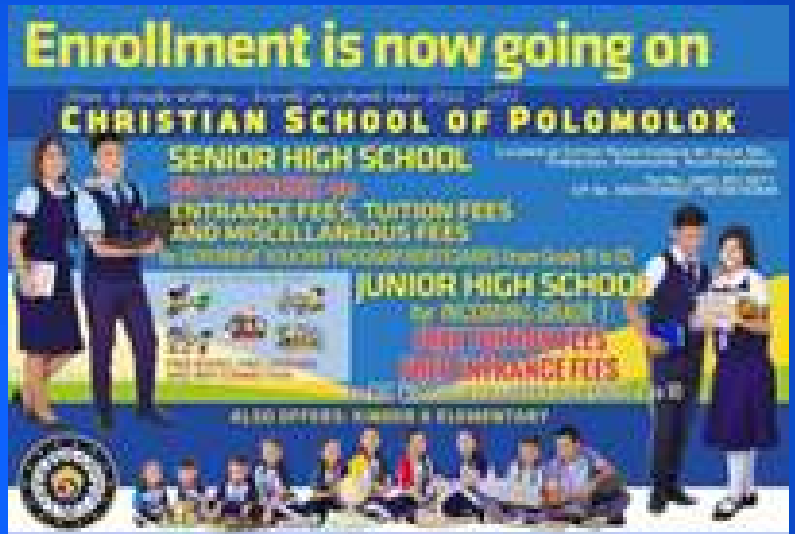
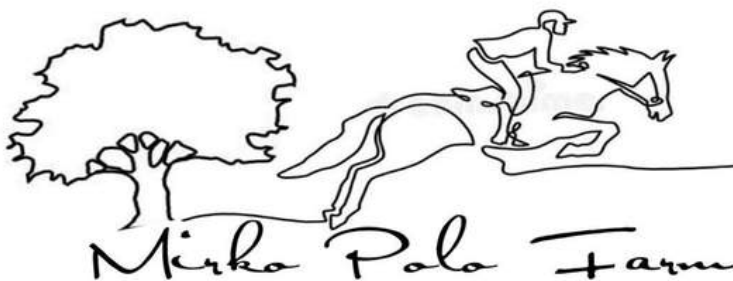
