R.I. PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

My Challenge to you

Peace does not happen by accident. It must be pursued deliberately, built strategically, and woven intentionally into everything we do. That is the challenge I am placing before the Rotary world this year.

Rotary recognizes peacebuilding as one of our areas of focus. But I believe peace must be more than a category of work we set aside for current projects. It must become a lens, one we choose to look through every time we plan, every time we serve, every time we ask what kind of impact we truly want to leave behind.

The Institute for Economics and Peace has identified eight Pillars of Positive Peace: well-functioning government, a sound business environment, equitable distribution of resources, acceptance of the rights of others, good relations with neighbours, free flow of information, high levels of human capital, and low levels of corruption. These pillars describe the conditions that make lasting peace possible. And when I look at them carefully, I see enormous potential for Rotary. Not because our work automatically advances peace but because it can when we are deliberate about it.

That is the key word: deliberate.

A water project does not build peace on its own. But a water project designed with the Pillars of Positive Peace in mind - one that asks how equitable access to resources strengthens community trust - can begin to lay that foundation. A vocational training program does not guarantee reconciliation. But one that intentionally brings divided communities together around shared economic opportunity can start to build it. The project does not change. The intention does.

In Columbia, Rotary's Pathway to Peace and Prosperity program shows us what this looks like in practice. Working in communities shaped by decades of armed conflict and displacement, the program combines economic empowerment with conflict resolution training and community-led reconciliation. Peace was not a hoped-for side effect. It was central to the design. That is the standard I am calling all of us to follow.

As you plan your next project, whatever the focus area, I want you to pause and ask one question: How does this create the condition for peace? Consult the Pillars of Positive Peace. Find where your work connects. Then, make that connection intentional. Share what you discover with your club, your district, and your community. The more we talk about peace as a practice rather than a destination, the more naturally it will shape everything we do.

This is not about doing different work. It is about doing our work differently, with greater awareness, greater purpose, and a clearer vision of the world we are trying to build. Every Rotary project carries potential. Our task is to unlock it, not by chance, but by choice.

Welcoming new members is always a special moment for our Rotary Club. Each new member brings fresh ideas, new experiences, and a willingness to serve and make a difference in our community.

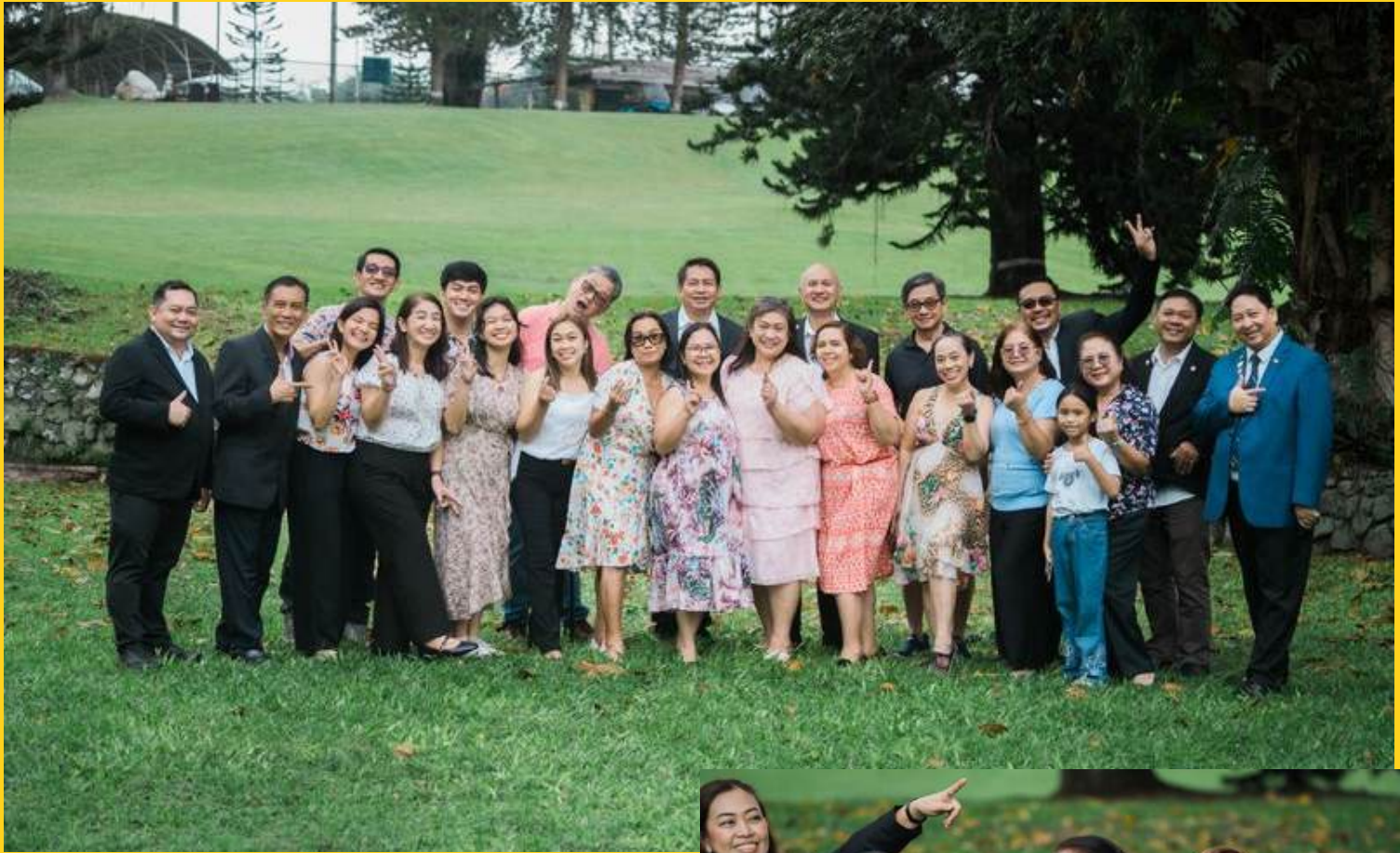

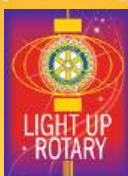

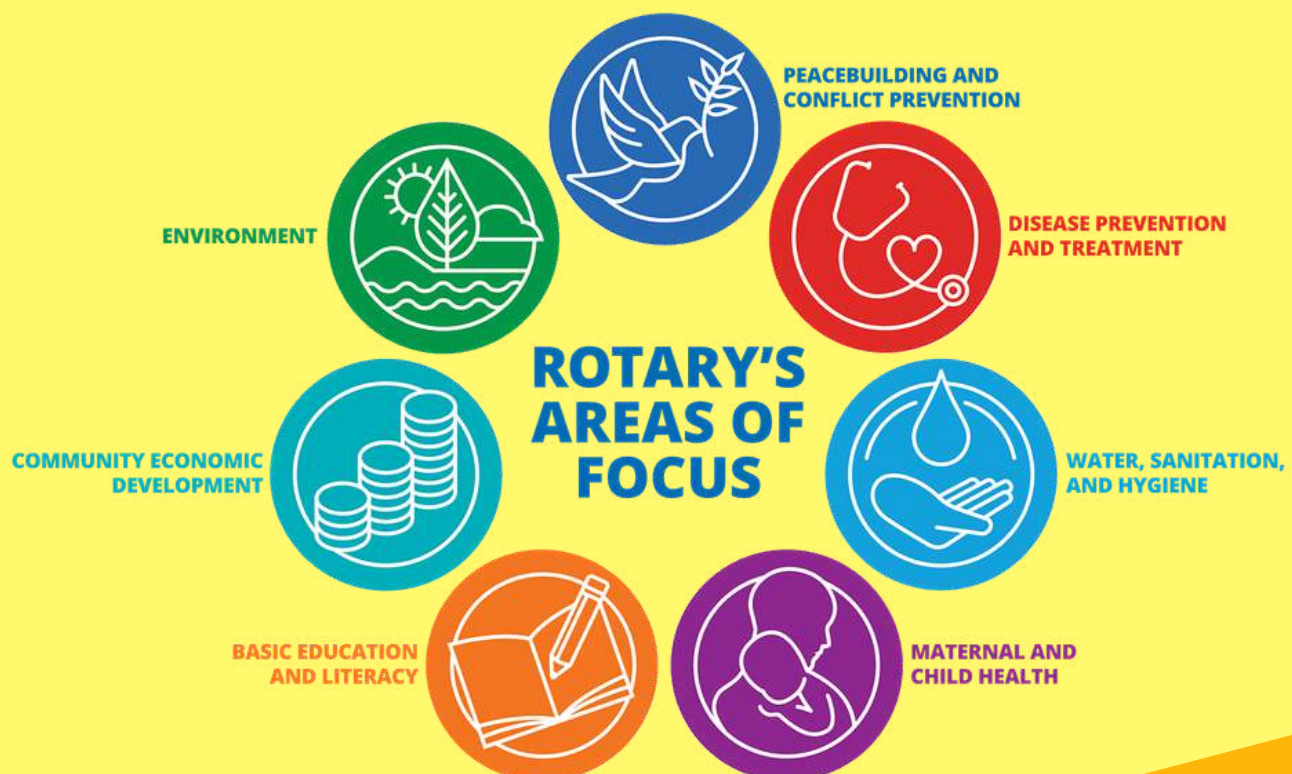

A Visit That Inspires: Governor Arlene Adlawan Brings Ideas, Heart, and Hope to Our Adopt-a-Daycare Project

The center, which was officially launched on July 13, 2026, in partnership with Barangay Magsaysay, serves Indigenous Peoples (IP) children in the community. It represents our club’s commitment to creating opportunities for children to learn, grow, and dream of a brighter future.

More Than a Project Visit

Governor Arlene’s visit was more than simply seeing the completed project. It became a meaningful opportunity for conversation, learning, sharing of ideas, and envisioning what more can be done for the children and the community.

With her keen eye and genuine concern for the beneficiaries, Governor Arlene generously shared practical suggestions on how we can further develop the daycare center. She encouraged us to make the learning environment more colorful, vibrant, welcoming, and engaging—a place where children will feel happy, comfortable, and excited to learn.

Her recommendations reminded us that a daycare center is more than four walls, chairs, tables, and learning materials. It should be a safe and inspiring space where young minds are nurtured and where children are encouraged to discover their potential.

Building a Community Around the Children

One of the important insights shared by Governor Arlene was the need to involve the mothers and guardians more actively in the development of the daycare.

The success of a project, after all, does not depend solely on the physical improvements we provide. It becomes more sustainable when the community itself takes part in caring for, supporting, and protecting the children.

And perhaps the greatest measure of this project will not be found in the walls we build or the things we provide, but in the dreams that we help children believe are possible.

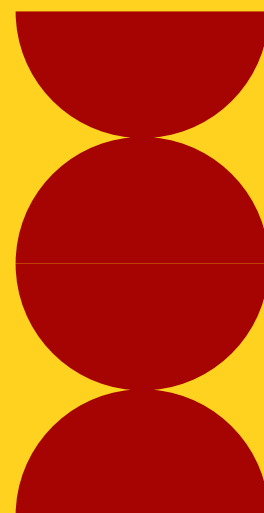

Later, seeing the opportunities in Polomolok, he established an extension office in 2024 for their company's dairy products distribution, supporting the Department of Education's School Feeding Program, with their main office based in Manila. But beyond business, what truly sets him apart is his heart for service.

One evening, during a fellowship, several of us happened to visit his newly opened coffee shop along the National Highway. It was there that I introduced him to Rotary. As we shared with him our mission of "Service Above Self," we quickly realized that we were not introducing him to a new way of life—we were simply giving a name to the values he had already been living. Even before becoming a Rotarian, he had always possessed a genuine desire to help those in need. So when I invited him to become part of our Rotary family, he did not hesitate. He simply said, "Yes." The rest, as they say, is history.
